

# Insurance Schools Courses & Learning Styles

There are **three learning styles**, that all students possess to varying degrees. These learning styles are “**visual**”, “**auditory**”, and “**kinesthetic**” **which is also referred to as “tactile”**.

Many adult learners remember being told when they were younger, that they had a single learning style. However, most people have a **dominant learning style**, but can benefit from using all three styles, to aid in the retention of course material.

The Virtual Classroom portion of the course that includes the Quick Notes Study Guide and 5-Question quizzes after each course module **engages all three learning styles, using the following methods:**

- **Visual Learning Style** - Information to read, videos to watch, graphs to assist in comprehension, and pictures and phrases, that help the learner make associations in their mind between the picture, and the course material.
- **Auditory Learning Style** - Audio files are included to engage an auditory learner. Additionally, there are many examples, that are included ONLY in the audio portion, to assist an auditory learner in absorbing, and retaining the information. Because these examples are included only in the audio files, this also assists in capturing the attention, of students with a short attention span.

- ***Kinesthetic Learning Style*** - Filling in the blanks of the study guide, and answering the quiz questions that require the learner to drag and drop puzzle pieces, to match correct answers, satisfy the need to move while learning. After completing the Quick Notes Study Guide, Kinesthetic learners can also benefit from walking around, while reading the study guide back to themselves, either silently or aloud.
